

Introduction of a Wealth Tax


In the recent MRBI poll¹ commissioned by the Community Platform, a total of 82% of the 1016 people questioned stated that they agreed that the Government should introduce a wealth tax on individuals who have net assets (including property, financial assets and luxury items) which are valued at more than one million euro and who have an annual individual income of more than a hundred thousand euro.

General

- From a gender perspective, women were slightly more likely to agree than men with 79% of men and 85% of women either agreed strongly or slightly with the question posed.
- From a regional perspective, Connaught Ulster was the region where those questioned were most likely to agree (89%). Those in the Dublin region were more likely to disagree with the question with 17% compared to 8% from the Connaught and Ulster region.
- In terms of social class, most likely to answer yes to the questions with 80% was the lowest social class category, 73% of whom agreed strongly.

It was those from the highest social class category who were more likely to strongly disagree at 21%, 14% of which disagreed strongly.

When the ages of those who agreed with the statement were analysed a large majority of each of the age groups agreed with the questions asked. A total of 89% of those aged 65+ years agreed with the statement, with 83% of them strongly agreeing.

From a regional perspective, those that agreed with the question posed were in a strong majority across the regions. Those in Connaught/Ulster were most likely to agree with the question posed, followed by Munster and the rest of Leinster. Those in the Dublin region were slightly less likely to agree, though 78% of them still agreed with the proposal.
