

"We have another 18 months of this situation until the youngest starts school. I'm counting the days. All our financial cushions are gone. There is nothing left"


## Choices

- Current Options
  - Staff competence and quality of service provided topped the poll.
  - Affordability, location and offering a recreational focus.

- Future Investment
  - All staff and childminders be appropriately trained and vetted
  - All services be registered, regulated and inspected
